WARM UP QUESTION: Have you ever been entrusted with something precious that didn't belong to you, yet you knew it was important to care for it well?

READ: Matthew 24:45-46

FOCUS: As God's stewards, we must lovingly tend to His household with an eternal purpose and an eternal perspective.

OBSERVE:

- When we are entrusted with something that is valuable, it is important to cherish the gift and use it in a way that honors the giver.
- God has given us many gifts, such as life, salvation, the Holy Spirit, jobs, possessions and many more! It is only right that we use our time, talents and treasure to honor Him.

REFLECT:

- Why is it difficult to shift from a lifestyle of ownership to stewardship?
- Where does the care of Jesus' household fall in the list of your priorities?
- How are you using the resources God has placed in your hands (time, talent, treasure) to care for His household?

TAKE ACTION:
